CT-guided drainage is a procedure that is done to drain a collection of fluid such as an abscess or a cyst. The radiologist uses the CT scanner to help guide the drainage catheter to the area of fluid collection. Once the drainage catheter is placed in the fluid collection site, it is secured, and a drainage bag is attached to the drainage catheter. The drainage catheter is usually left in place for approximately two to five days and then removed.

WHAT TO EXPECT

When you arrive for your procedure, you will be taken to the Radiology receiving area, where you will be asked to put on a gown, have your vital signs taken and an IV started. You will then be taken to the CT department, where a CT technologist will explain the procedure to you, answer any questions you have and have you sign consent forms for the procedure.

You will be placed on a CT scanner table in a position that will allow the radiologist to access the area of interest in the safest way. You may be lying on your back, stomach or side.

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The radiologist will talk to you to make sure your questions have been answered and take some preliminary scans. The radiologist will look at the preliminary scans and determine the best spot to place the needle. Your skin will be cleaned with an antibacterial soap, then a local anesthetic will be used to numb the area. A needle will be placed in the skin and guided using the CT scanner.

BIOPSY PROCEDURE: Once a sample of tissue has been obtained, the needle will be removed.

DRAINAGE PROCEDURE: Once the catheter has been placed, it will be secured, and a drainage bag will be attached to the drainage catheter.

WHAT TO EXPECT AFTER THE PROCEDURE

You will be taken back to the Radiology receiving area, where our nursing staff will monitor you. Your vital signs will be taken, and the nurses will address your medical needs. Once you are discharged to go home, you will need to rest and limit your activity for the rest of the day.

LENGTH OF EXAM

Plan on being in the department for *at least four hours*. Your discharge depends on how you feel after the procedure and the radiologist post-procedure protocol.
